The formula of the dem.dic. of prol.&peasantry in large
particularity has a TERRIFIC character... He did not exclude the
possibility that the peasantry would be represented in the rev. by an independent
party. I emphasize the decisive significance of the agrarian Rev.
the fate of bourgeois rev., I was, at least since the autumn of 1902, that
from the moment of my flight abroad, a pupil of Lenin, yet I came out
with the formula "dem.dic. of prol.&peasantry". Because I saw its short-
comings immediately that it left open the question of what class the real dic.
would belong to. I endeavored to show that in spite of its enormous social
weightiness the peasantry was incapable of creating a BEMERLY INDEPENDENT

Finally I never endeavored to create a grouping on the basis of the
theory of the per.rev. My inner-party stand was a conciliatory one

xvi: "The weak point of Lenin's concept was its
inherently contradictory notion "the dem.dic. of the prol.&peasantry"... The
peasantry was dispersed over the surface of an immense country, with cities
as points of contact. BY ITSELF THE PEASANTRY WAS INCAPABLE EVEN OF
FORMULATING its own interests.... True, in ancient China revolutio's brought
peasantry to power, or rather, the military leaders of peasant insurrections.
After writing pamphlet "Until the 9th of Jan." I REPEATEDLY returned
to the dev. & the grounding of the theory of per.rev... the peasantry is utterly
incapable of an independent pol. role... I deem it (dem.dic. of prol.&peasantry)
unrealizable... The insufficiently in the perspective of Bol. did not become
apparent in 1905 ONLY BECAUSE the rev. itself did undergo further dev...."

the dem.dic. by any barrier, but was uninterruptedly connected with it...
Such as in broad outline the essence of the conception of the per. (uninterrupted)
re. It was precisely this conception that guaranteed the victory of the prol. in
Oct."
