Isaac Deutscher, a specialist in Russian affairs since 1925, has been a brilliant contributor to both the London Observer and The Economist. Born near Cracow in 1907, he lived in Poland until 1920, when he went to London as a correspondent for Polish newspapers. In Warsaw he was active as a literary critic, economist, and a political publicist and had the opportunity to travel in Russia and in the Ukraine.

Mr. Deutscher har bash a member of the editorial staff of The Keenewist since (1942,) working in various capacities, including that of chief European and military government, but reinly as an expect on Russis. From 1942 through 1946 he was also on the staff of the Observer as a special writer on diplomatical fairs and roving correspondent in Europe. In addition, ander the pen name of Foregrine, he wrote a popular weakly teature, European Matebook, He was also the author of many Profiles of outstanding European personalties.

In addition to his work for The Bocnomist and the Observer, Br. Doutschar has broadcast for the B.B.O. Third Programms. He has also contributed institute of International Affairs. He has also contributed articles to The Times of London and The New York Times.

At present he is engaged on work on a Social History of Soviet Russia and on two more biographies, Trotaky in Exile and Lenin, which, together with Stalin, will form a trilogy. He is also preparing material on modern Russian history for the new edition of the Cambridge Modern History.
