Dear Dr. Mason:

Enclosed is the list of documents, photos, books, posters and other items we think you might want to include in your exhibit for the March 21 lecture by Raya -- a list we found very difficult to develop, because there was so very much more that we would have liked to include. We had to make some hard choices, trying to balance the kind of "categories" we felt should be covered against the kind of material that would be graphically appealing. You will notice that we included in the listing what size and colors various posters and leaflets represent. There were several larger posters (some quite dramatic and colorful) that we passed over for space limitations -- but should there be room for more, we will gladly supply them.

We have tried to indicate which items would be three-dimensional for the cases -- or are documents that are originals and therefore would have to be enclosed in the protective cases. Some items could be either blown up for the panels or included as actual pamphlets or books, as you would prefer.

There are a few items listed that we are still locating and that we marked "to come" -- all others should be included in the xeroxes we are enclosing, except for posters that were too large and are therefore described as to size and color on the list, or are documents held in your vaults.

All the items will have to have concise, descriptive captions, of course. How is it that you will want to handle those? Do you want us to work up captions for all the items that you decide on including? The descriptions in the attached listing are very cursory -- just enough, we hope, to let you know which would have to come out of your vaults (we included the precise Archives pages), and to identify the xerox for your own information. The titles of the "categories" are, likewise, very rough -- just enough to let you know what we had in mind for the sort of groupings we thought might make an interesting panel or case.

Finally, let me apologize for the less-than-perfect typing of the list. We were working under a bit of "duress" -- though this was certainly a labor of love for all of us involved in searching out and choosing the 118 items we wound up with from the wealth of material we wanted to include.

We look forward to hearing what you decide and will hurry what you need to Detroit as soon as we hear from you.
